



## **Donate Life Today Registry**

The Montana and Washington Donate Life Today Registry is a confidential database of donation wishes to be carried out at the time of death. The database is managed and accessed only by donation professionals.

Registering your donation wishes provides legal consent to donate organ, eyes, and tissues for both transplant and research.

### **How to become a registered donor in Montana and Washington**

- Call toll-free at 1-877-275-5269 and request a brochure to fill out and return.
- Say YES to organ, eye, and tissue donation when you renew your driver's license. Residents who already have a heart on their driver's license are automatically added to the Donate Life Today Registry.

### **How to become a registered donor in Alaska**

- Register online at [www.alaskadonorregistry.org](http://www.alaskadonorregistry.org)
- Call toll-free at 1-800-719-5433 and request a brochure to fill out and return.
- Say YES to organ, eye, and tissue donation when you renew your driver's license. Residents who already have a heart on their driver's license are automatically added to the Alaska Donor Registry.

### **How to become a registered donor in Idaho**

- Register online at [www.yesidaho.org](http://www.yesidaho.org)
- Call the Idaho Donor Registry toll-free at 1-866-937-4324
- Say YES to organ, eye, and tissue donation when you renew your driver's license. Residents who already have the word DONOR on their driver's license are automatically added to the Idaho Donor Registry.

## Frequently Asked Questions

*What organs, eyes, and tissues can I donate?*

Transplantable organs, eyes, and tissues include: heart, lungs, liver, kidneys, pancreas, small intestine, heart valves, skin, bone, connective tissue, veins, eyes, and corneas.

*Why should I consider being a donor?*

- One organ, eye, and tissue donor can save or enhance the lives of over 50 people.
- Over 100,000 people in the United States are waiting for a life saving organ transplant, including almost 1,600 of our Northwest neighbors.
- Sadly, 18 people die each day waiting for a life saving organ transplant.

*Who runs the registry?*

The registry is managed by LifeCenter Northwest. One the 58 federally-designated non-profit organ procurement organizations (OPO) in the United States, LifeCenter Northwest saves and enhances lives by facilitating the recovery of organs and tissues in Alaska, Montana, North Idaho, and Washington. By educating the community about the need and the importance for people to register their donation wishes, we hope to help the nearly 100,000 people waiting for a transplant.

*What if I want to make limitations on what I am willing to donate or have changed my mind about being a donor?*

If you would like to make limitations, you may do so in two ways. If you have internet access, visit [www.donatelifetoday.com](http://www.donatelifetoday.com) and create a record reflecting your wishes. This new record will replace any older records. You can also request a brochure to fill out and mail back by called 1-877-275-5269 or pick on up at any Department of Licensing or vehicle licensing office. For removals please call 1-877-275-5269.
